WISDOM'S INCLUSIVENESS—

There is no end to wisdom. The more we understand, the more we realize the immensities beyond us. Pride shuts us in and stops us short. Wisdom is expanding and accepting in humility that there is more to learn. Wisdom is truth refined through spiritual perception to bring understanding.

We accede to the wisdom of God, but how do we acquire wisdom? To be wise one must have a long-range view. One must have come up in consciousness to conceive and perceive the purpose of life. Wisdom is tolerant because it knows the Plan. Wisdom is generous with others because it has been earned through understanding the trials and errors of growth.

A wise man sees the whole picture. A fool is blinded and seeks a goal that has a dead end. A wise man does not scorn his brother. Wisdom puts all of life's pieces into place—into perspective—and perceives the purpose and the fulfillment for each man.

ACCURACY'S SIMPLICITY—

Like the beauty of the words the Masters use to instruct, a sentence says it, but it takes a lifetime to live it. To be accurate is to be on exact center; when you are on center, you do not have to reason, confirm, influence, or elaborate. The truth is and is simple and clean cut.

Ponder these keynotes no less than three times daily until your whole being renders explicit obedience to their principles. Mentally analyze the star-like points, as they are introduced, with ever-increasing

creativity.
